

In 2003, the National Round Table on the Environment and the Economy (NRTEE) released the report *Cleaning up the Past, Building the Future: A National Brownfield Redevelopment Strategy for Canada*. In the spring of 2008, OCETA on behalf of the Canadian Brownfields Network (CBN) and in collaboration with the NRTEE conducted a market research study to identify the actions that have been undertaken in response to the recommendations in the NRTEE Brownfield Strategy, including initiatives and activities since 2003, current market leaders and relevant barriers to obtain a snapshot of public and private sector actions to address the NRTEE recommendations.

The table below includes many of the tools and resources that were identified during the 2008 study and are extracted from Appendix A of the *State of Canada's Brownfield Redevelopment Industry Report*, a snapshot of Canada's brownfield redevelopment industry.
